Note to the conductor

Singapore's beautiful Fort Canning Park hosts four species of birds; the black-naped oriole, the collared kingfisher, the coppersmith barbet and the yellow-vented bulbul.

The opening chords represent the experience of entering Fort Canning Park; climbing the stairs, leaving all traffic noises behind, entering the magical world of tropical birdlife.

Fort Canning Park reveals itself as a worldwide symbol of relaxation, meditation and inspiration. Also to my beloved friend Leong Weifen, who painted this miracle of nature in her poem.

The example Fort Canning Park sets worldwide, is brought to attention by the songbird on stage. Luckily we can still enjoy songbirds in many countries on our precious planet.

Therefore the choice of this delicate singer is free to the conductor.

A winged habitant of any area where this music is performed, would be warmly welcomed.

May the duets between songbird and flute player lead to the deepest respect for birdlife worldwide. Should our feathered friend decide to remain silent, then its visual presence will still not fail to make an impression.

It is highly recommended however to rehearse in the presence of the songbird as many times as possible.

Please perform this music as an opening piece for the first or second half of your concert. The songbird has to be on stage before the musicians and the audience enter the hall. Gradually adapting to the situation will stimulate the songbird's natural behaviour. Its singing before the sound of the opening chords could very well be the best omen for a wonderful performance.
